September 10th, 2023**

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Then I said, "I will not make mention of Him, Nor speak anymore in His name." But *His word* was in my heart like a burning fire Shut up in my bones; I was weary of holding *it* back, And I could not. **Jeremiah 20:9 NKJV**

Are you on fire for God?

Now Pashhur the son of Immer, the priest who *was* also chief governor in the house of the Lord, heard that Jeremiah prophesied these things. **Jeremiah 20:1 NKJV**

Then Pashhur struck Jeremiah the prophet, and put him in the stocks that *were* in the high gate of Benjamin, which was by the house of the Lord. **Jeremiah 20:2 NKJV**

O Lord, You induced me, and I was persuaded; You are stronger than I, and have prevailed. I am in derision daily; Everyone mocks me. **Jeremiah 20:7 NKJV**

People on fire for God will receive criticism

Woe to you when all men speak well of you, For so did their fathers to the false prophets. **Luke 6:26 NKJV**

People on fire for God cannot remain silent

Then I said, "I will not make mention of Him, Nor speak anymore in His name." But His word was in my heart like a burning fire Shut up in my bones; I was weary of holding it back, And I could not. **Jeremiah 20:9 NKJV**

Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God. **2 Corinthians 5:20 NKJV**

Are you on fire for God?

"I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot. **Revelation 3:15 NKJV**

I counsel you to buy from Me gold refined in the fire, that you may be rich; and white garments, that you may be clothed, that the shame of your nakedness may not be revealed; and anoint your eyes with eye salve, that you may see. **Revelation 3:18 NKJV**

September 10

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In this series, we will learn the story of Abraham and Sarah, plus all of their kids, and their grandkids! God had blessed Abraham with a huge family! We will learn of how special God made families.

Memory Verse: “God made families.” Genesis 1:26a (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: God Made Families, and He Made My Family, Too.

Parent Connect: Tell your toddler that they used to be a baby too when God made them and added them to your family. Show them pictures of when they were a baby. Using the craft they made or a favorite baby doll show them how to care for their baby and help them practice. Ask them “Who made you?” and “Who made our family?” (God).



In this series, we will learn how trusting in the Lord will lead us on the right path. We will see how Joseph went through many trials that God turned from bad into good!

Memory Verse: “Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all ways, submit to Him and He will make your paths straight.” Proverbs 3:5-6

Heart of the Lesson: Joseph’s Coat and Slavery – Genesis 37

Parent Connect: Today in our story we learned of Joseph and his brothers. We learned about the bad things that happened to Joseph when his brothers felt jealous of him. Play a game with kid all about different emotions; happy, sad, jealous, confusion, etc. Each person takes a turn acting out an emotion and the other person guesses what it is.



When Jesus comes to live in your heart, it changes you. His love lights a fire inside that we can’t contain. His fire is contagious. It wants to grow and burn brighter and brighter. In this series, we will discover what it looks like to be on fire for God and how we can share this powerful love in our neighborhoods to the ends of the earth.

Memory Verse: His word burns in my heart like a fire. It's like a fire in my bones! I am worn out trying to hold it in! I can't do it!" Jeremiah 20:9b

Heart of the Lesson: On Fire For God - Luke 24:13-49

Parent Connect: When we talk about being on fire for God, we are talking about an invisible spiritual fire burning inside of us. This fire is the presence of God in us. The fire gives us our love for Jesus, our desire to follow Him, and our love and care for others because of Him. Talk to your kids about different ways we can feed the fire in us.

Memory Verse: “Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. Matthew 7:7-8

Heart of the Lesson: Why did Jesus die for us, imperfect people? Revelation 4:8, Psalm 99:9, Psalm 18:3, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Romans 3:23-28, 1 John 5:11-13, Titus 1:2

Parent Connect: Write a verse that reminds you of God’s gift of salvation with an expo marker on your mirror. Every time you see it, thank God for sending Jesus to save us.
