Let me now remind you, dear brothers and sisters, of the Good News I preached to you before. You welcomed it then, and you still stand firm in it. - **1 Corinthians 15:1 NLT**

Jesus is our hope

Therefore, if anyone *is* in Christ, *he is* a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new. **2 Corinthians 5:17**

Now all things *are* of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation, **2 Corinthians 5:18**

that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation. **2 Corinthians 5:19**

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. **Romans 15:13**

Share the message of Jesus' hope

Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore *you* on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God. **2 Corinthians 5:20**

For He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him. **2 Corinthians 5:21**

But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, **1 Peter 3:15**

For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things *done* in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad. **2 Corinthians 5:10**

Knowing, therefore, the terror of the Lord, we persuade men; but we are well known to God, and I also trust are well known in your consciences. **2 Corinthians 5:11**

Parent Connect: This year we have a goal of memorizing Romans Road. Hang up their Romans Road coloring sheet in an area where it can be seen every day to practice. Share a way that you feel comfortable sharing the Gospel.



The word "gospel" is used over 75 times in the New Testament! "Gospel" is translated from Greek and means Good News! What is this Good News? Join us the next five weeks as we learn the Good News, and how to share it with our friends.
