Heart of the Lesson: God Keeps Us Safe and Provides for Us

Parent Connect: Make a fun Noah's Ark theme snack with your toddler, and talk about how God provides food for us, and how he provided for the animals on the Ark as well and kept them safe and fed



In this series, kids will learn that no matter what happens – whether we're doing big things for God like Josiah, making mistakes like Jonah, feeling sad like the people of Jerusalem or standing strong like Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego- God is with us!

Memory Verse: "Be still and know that I am God. I will be honored by every nation. I will be honored throughout the world." Psalm 46:10

Heart of the Lesson: The Fiery Furnace | Daniel 3

Parent Connect: This week we learned about Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego and the story of the fiery furnace. This week, play with a Mr. Potato Head or Legos with your kid. As you play, remind them that God's people made things with their hands too, and they decided to worship those things instead of God. Discuss how that must have made God feel.



God gives! God's generosity is one of the key themes that runs throughout the entire Bible. From God giving us life in Genesis to God giving us His one and only son in the New Testament, in this series, we are going to explore generosity in our own lives using what God has already given us.

Memory Verse: You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully." 2 Corinthians 9:7

Heart of the Lesson: God gives us a heart for generosity | Acts 2

Parent Connect: God gives us a heart for generosity! God's character is to be a generous God and for us to help others. Find an opportunity to do a random act of kindness for someone in your community! Whether its baking and delivering cookies or volunteering with a local outreach partner, find time to be the hands and feet of Jesus as a family!



God gives generously. He gave us everything, and our generosity is a response of thankfulness for who He is and everything He has done. What does it look like for a 5th-6th grade student to be generous with their time, talents, and treasures? How does God want us to share Him with those around us and those around the world? In this series, we'll explore what it means to live generously, giving because God first gave to us.

Memory Verse: "And God will generously provide all you need. Then you will always have everything you need and plenty left over to share with others." 2 Corinthians 9:8

Heart of the Lesson: God gives His people a heart for the nations – Matthew 28:19-20, Revelation 7:9-10

Parent Connect: Today we looked at people in the Bible who were given a mission from God, like Abraham, Moses, and Joshua. We also looked at how Jesus gave us the Great Commission to share the good news with the world. Talk with your student about how your family can be part of God's mission in different areas and routines of your life. How can you live your life on mission at school? In your neighborhood? In a serving opportunity?
