Love one another

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. **John 13:34 NKJV**

By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." **John 13:35 NKJV**

Are you “loving one another” in the church like Jesus did?

Experiencing Jesus’ way of living – community & connection with the church

Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that His hour had come that He should depart from this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end. **John 13:1 NKJV**

And supper being ended, the devil having already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon’s son, to betray Him, **John 13:2 NKJV**

Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come from God and was going to God, **John 13:3 NKJV**

rose from supper and laid aside His garments, took a towel and girded Himself. **John 13:4 NKJV**

After that, He poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples’ feet, and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded. **John 13:5 NKJV**

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This month we are learning that Jesus is alive, and that He loves us! We are learning the Easter story and how Jesus raised from the dead for us!

Memory Verse: “Jesus is Alive” Mark 16:6B (Adapted for Toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: Jesus is Alive and Loves Us

Parent Connect: Today in class your toddler made an Easter puzzle. Help your toddler put the pieces together and then read the puzzle to your toddler. Say: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Jesus is Alive! I'm so happy that Jesus is Alive! Put the puzzle together several times this week repeating this simple sentence to your toddler.



In this series we will learn about Jesus teachings, His miracles, His death and resurrection. We will wrap up with Jesus' ascension as He goes to Heaven. Through the series, we will learn each story shows us how Jesus loves us and how Jesus is the perfect example of how we should love others!

Memory Verse: “For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life.” John 3:16 (NLT)

Heart of the Lesson: Good Samaritan | Luke 10:25-37

Parent Connect: Today we learned a Good Samaritan who helped a hurt man. The Good Samaritan bandaged the man's wound. Make a “Good Samaritan Bandage” snack with your kid. You will need a graham cracker, white icing for the gauze, and red icing for the blood.



G.R.O.W. fosters spiritual growth, like plants nurtured in fertile soil. This series explores what happens when we spend time with God: Growth, Rest, Outreach, and Worship.

Memory Verse: But the godly will flourish like palm trees and grow strong like cedars of Lebanon. For they are transplanted to the LORD's own house. They flourish in the courts of our God. Even in old age they will still produce fruit; they will remain vital and green. Psalm 92:12-14

Heart of the Lesson: Spending Time with God Helps Us Grow - Psalm 1

Parent Connect: Go to the store, buy a small plant and take a picture of it. Take care of it as a family and mark your calendar for 1 month, 3 months, and 6 months and watch it grow. If the plant dies talk about why it died, and how important it is to get the right nutrients in our faith.



Did you know that there are more than 50 commands of how Christians should treat one another in the New Testament? In this series, we will be exploring the different “one another” passages to discover what it looks like to be in the body of Christ.

Memory Verse: “So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other.” John 13:34

Heart of the Lesson: As Christians, we are called to love one another – John 13:34-35

Parent Connect: As a family, do a random act of kindness. Discuss what it means that we are called to love one another in the body of Christ.



We need each other in the church! Our church family can encourage us and help us grow closer to Jesus. But we need to build friendships with each other to be able to help each other grow closer to Jesus! This series, we’re looking at what the Bible says about how we can love one another well so that we know Jesus better too.

Memory Verse: I give you a new command. Love one another. You must love one another, just as I have loved you. (John 13:34 NIRV)

Heart of the Lesson: We can’t “love one another” without each other! (John 13:34-35, Romans 12:5, John 13:1-5, 12-15)
