Parent Connect: Read today's activity sheet to your toddler. Ask your toddler to show you where Jonah is hiding on the activity sheet. Ask: "Who can see Jonah even when he's in the belly of the fish?" (God)

Make bread or a treat this week and show them how much flour goes into it. God kept the flour and oil from drying up for the widow, that is a miracle!
