When does God want us to avoid risks?

1. When going against God or His Word

And Moses said, "Now why do you transgress the command of the Lord? For this will not succeed. Numbers 14:41 NKJV

2. When foolishly tempting God to provide for you

Jesus said to him, "It is written again, 'You shall not tempt the Lord your God.' " Matthew 4:7 NKJV

When does God want us to allow risks?

1. When Jesus is prompting you to trust Him

And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." Matthew 14:28 NKJV

So He said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. Matthew 14:29 NKJV

2. When experimenting with ways to minister the gospel

Now those who were scattered after the persecution that arose over Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Antioch, preaching the word to no one but the Jews only. Acts 11:19 NKJV

But some of them were men from Cyprus and Cyrene, who, when they had come to Antioch, spoke to the Hellenists, preaching the Lord Jesus. Acts 11:20 NKJV

What obstacles do we face to allowing risks?

Fear of criticism

(Galatians 1:10)

Fear of failure (Romans 8:28)

Focus on self (2 Timothy 3:2)

What's at stake if we don't allow risks?

GOD'S PROMISE TO ABRAHAM

Memory Verse: God made families. Genesis 1:26a (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: God Made My Family

Parent Engagement: Play with the craft your toddler made in class. As you play, ask "How do families care for babies?" and "Who gives families kids to love?" Invite the toddlers to wrap their pretend babies in the blankets and cuddle them. Say: God made families, and families love their kids and care for them just as Abraham and Sarah cared for baby Isaac.
