Jesus will return to earth to defeat His enemies.

Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him *was* called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war. **Revelation 19:11 NKJV**

His eyes *were* like a flame of fire, and on His head *were* many crowns. He had a name written that no one knew except Himself. **Revelation 19:12 NKJV**

He *was* clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God. **Revelation 19:13 NKJV**

And the armies in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, followed Him on white horses. **Revelation 19:14 NKJV**

Now out of His mouth goes a sharp sword, that with it He should strike the nations. And He Himself will rule them with a rod of iron. He Himself treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. **Revelation 19:15 NKJV**

And He has on *His* robe and on His thigh a name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS. **Revelation 19:16 NKJV**

How are you preparing for His return?

Jesus will reign with His saints for 1000 years

Then I saw an angel coming down from heaven, having the key to the bottomless pit and a great chain in his hand. **Revelation 20:1 NKJV**

He laid hold of the dragon, that serpent of old, who is *the* Devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years; **Revelation 20:2 NKJV**

and he cast him into the bottomless pit, and shut him up, and set a seal on him, so that he should deceive the nations no more till the thousand years were finished. But after these things he must be released for a little while. **Revelation 20:3 NKJV**

And I saw thrones, and they sat on them, and judgment was committed to them. Then *I saw* the souls of those who had been beheaded for their witness to Jesus and for the word of God, who had not worshiped the beast or his image, and had not received *his* mark on their foreheads or on their hands. And they lived and reigned with Christ for a thousand years. **Revelation 20:4 NKJV**

How are you preparing to reign with Him?

Jesus will judge the dead at the Final Judgment

Then I saw a great white throne and Him who sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away. And there was found no place for them. **Revelation 20:11 NKJV**

And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is *the Book* of Life. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books. **Revelation 20:12 NKJV**

And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire. Revelation 20:15 NKJV

Memory Verse: Jesus was born. Luke 2.

Heart of the Lesson: Jesus Was Born in a Stable

Parent Connect: Pull out your family nativity or a kid's nativity and look at the different pieces. How many of the people can your kid name? Practice pointing to and saying the names of Mary, Joseph, and baby Jesus this week.



This month we will be learning about the people that Jesus sent to start the early church! We'll learn that we have the same mission as them, to share Jesus with everyone!

Memory Verse: For you are to be his witness, telling everyone what you have seen and heard. What are you waiting for? Acts 22:15-16a

Heart of the Lesson: Gabriel brought Good News - Luke 1, Matthew 1

Parent Connect: This week we're starting our new Christmas series. Let your kid help you set up your family nativity set. Can your kid name all of the people in the nativity?



Jesus is the light of the world. He chases away the darkness of sin and evil. He lights our path and shows us where to go. As we enjoy the lights of this Christmas season, let's celebrate the birth of the Savior, the light of the world.

Memory Verse: Jesus spoke to the people once more and said, "I am the light of the world. If you follow me, you won't have to walk in darkness, because you will have the light that leads to life." John 8:12

Heart of the Lesson: Preparing for the Light - Luke 1:76-79, John 1:6-9

Parent Connect: Have your kids pretend to be Zachariah and retell today's story. Ask them "What is something God has promised you that is hard to believe?"

Heart of the Lesson: What will it be like when Jesus comes back? - Revelation 19-20, Acts 2:17-21

Parent Connect: Draw a picture of what you want to be doing when Jesus comes back. As you do, pray that you will be prepared and you'll help others be prepared, too.
