Mephibosheth (2 Samuel 4 & 9)

Everything physical in the Old Testament pictures something spiritual in the New Testament

Jonathan, Saul's son, had a son who was lame in his feet. He was five years old when the news about Saul and Jonathan came from Jezreel; and his nurse took him up and fled. And it happened, as she made haste to flee, that he fell and became lame. His name was Mephibosheth. **2 Samuel 4:4 NKJV**

Then the king said, "Is there not still someone of the house of Saul, to whom I may show the kindness of God?" And Ziba said to the king, "There is still a son of Jonathan who is lame in his feet." 2 Samuel 9:3 NKJV

So the king said to him, "Where is he?" And Ziba said to the king, "Indeed he is in the house of Machir the son of Ammiel, in Lo Debar." **2 Samuel 9:4 NKJV**

Then King David sent and brought him out of the house of Machir the son of Ammiel, from Lo Debar. **2 Samuel 9:5 NKJV**

Now when Mephibosheth the son of Jonathan, the son of Saul, had come to David, he fell on his face and prostrated himself. Then David said, "Mephibosheth?" And he answered, "Here is your servant!" **2 Samuel 9:6 NKJV**

So David said to him, "Do not fear, for I will surely show you kindness for Jonathan your father's sake, and will restore to you all the land of Saul your grandfather; and you shall eat bread at my table continually." **2 Samuel 9:7 NKJV**

Then he bowed himself, and said, "What is your servant, that you should look upon such a dead dog as I?" **2 Samuel 9:8 NKJV**

..."As for Mephibosheth," said the king, "he shall eat at my table like one of the king's sons."

2 Samuel 9:11 NKIV

So Mephibosheth dwelt in Jerusalem, for he ate continually at the king's table. And he was lame in both his feet. **2 Samuel 9:13 NKJV**

Mephibosheth was a recipient (thankful & undeserving) of David's amazing grace

Memory Verse: "God made families." Genesis 1:26a (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: God Made Families and Families Can Worship Together

Parent Connect: Turn on some worship music and have a dance/worship party with your family! Encourage them to use their shakers or other instruments you may have and remind them that "God made families and families can worship together".

GOD IS MIGHTY

In this series, kids will discover that God is mighty- stronger than sickness, armies, fear and even enemies! Through the stories of Elisha's miracles, Jehoshaphat's victory through praise, Naaman's healing, and Hezekiah's trust in God, kids will learn that God helps His people in powerful ways.

Memory Verse: Don't be afraid, for I am with you. Don't be discouraged, for I am your God." Isaiah 41:10a

Heart of the Lesson: Ellisha and Naaman | 2 Kings 5:1-1

Parent Connect: Check out our craft from this week and practice retelling the story from 2 Kings 5:1-19. This is the story of Elisha and Naaman, and how Naaman was healed from Leprosy! As you read the story, have your kid act it out with their craft



The Kid's Choice series gives our kids an opportunity to choose what we talk about. In this series, we will answer three big questions all about the Bible. Who wrote it? How do we know its true? Why should I read it? All of this and more will get answered.

Memory Verse: "Then Jesus called for the children and said to the disciples, "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of God belongs to those who are like these children." Luke 18:16

Heart of the Lesson: We can trust the Bible! | 2 Peter 1:19-2

Parent Connect: We can trust the Bible! Different elements of the Bible have been proved throughout history and even though there are still some things we are waiting on to be proven, we know we can trust the Bible because of what has been proven before. Do some trust falls as a family. Practice trusting what you know is there, even when you can't always see it!

Grace is God giving us what we don't deserve: kindness, forgiveness, and a place in His family. In this series, we'll learn how to see grace the way that God does. We will explore what grace looks like, how it shows up in the Bible, and how it changes our everyday lives.

Memory Verse: "God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God." Ephesians 2:8

Heart of the Lesson: God's Grace to Mephibosheth: Acceptance - God's grace welcomes us into His family. (2 Samuel 4, 9)

Parent Connect: Reflect together on areas where your student struggles with feeling accepted: maybe that's at school, with friends, or in sports. Talk about how God's grace doesn't depend on performance or popularity and encourage your student to journal about what God's grace means to them and how it makes them feel.
