Christ-centered friendships bring partnership, intimacy and joy

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, concerning the Word of life – **1 John 1:1 NKJV**

the life was manifested, and we have seen, and bear witness, and declare to you that eternal life which was with the Father and was manifested to us -1 John 1:2 NKJV

Who should a follower of Jesus Date

- Do not be unequally yoked together with unbelievers. For what fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness? And what communion has light with darkness? **2 Corinthians 6:14 NKJV**
- "You shall not plow with an ox and a donkey together." Deuteronomy 22:10 NKJV
- Proverbs 31:30
- Proverbs 20:6-7

How should a follower of Jesus Date

- I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, *which is* your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what *is* that good and acceptable and perfect will of God. **Romans 12: 1-2 NKJV**



<u>Marriage - Live Selflessly</u> (Eph 5:21-33) – Relationships 101 STUDY NOTES || SPEAKING KENT & KIM LILES

In a Christ-centered marriage there is mutual submission - (Ephesians 5:21)

- submitting to one another in the fear of God. **Ephesians 5:21 NKJV**
- Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves to *your* elders. Yes, all of *you* be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility, for "God resists the proud, But gives grace to the humble." 1 Peter 5:5 NKJV
- Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. Ephesians 5:22 NKJV
- For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body. **Ephesians 5:23 NKJV**
- Therefore, just as the church is subject to Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything. **Ephesians 5:24 NKJV**

In a Christ-centered marriage a husband loves his wife - (Eph 5:25-33)

- Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, Ephesians 5:25 NKJV

Love her enough to sacrifice for her

 Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, Ephesians 5:25 NKJV

Love her enough to lead her spiritually

- that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish. **Ephesians 5:26-27 NKJV**

Love her like you love your own body

So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord *does* the church. Ephesians 5:28-29 NKJV

In a Christ-centered marriage a wife respects her husband - (Ephesians 5:33)

- Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife *see* that she respects *her* husband. **Ephesians 5:33 NKJV**
- Wives, likewise, *be* submissive to your own husbands, that even if some do not obey the word, they, without a word, may be won by the conduct of their wives, **1 Peter 3:1 NKJV**

In a Christ-centered marriage the Gospel is Revealed (Eph 5:32)

- This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church. **Ephesians 5:32 NKJV**

Parent Engagement: Take a walk outside (take binoculars if you have them) and look for birds. How does Jesus take care of the birds? How does Jesus take care of us?
