O-utward Focus

Acts 13:3-4

What are some indicators of inward focus?

- People become a bother to you
- Your world shrinks & problems grow
- You think about God very little

How does God describe outward focus?

For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Mark 10:45 NKJV

Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others.

Philippians 2:4 NKJV

Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, Philippians 2:5 NKJV

For I am hard-pressed between the two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better.

Philippians 1:23 NKJV

Nevertheless to remain in the flesh is more needful for you. Philippians 1:24 NKJV

How does God describe outward focus?

Then one of them, named Agabus, stood up and showed by the Spirit that there was going to be a great famine throughout all the world, which also happened in the days of Claudius Caesar. **Acts 11:28 NKJV**

Then the disciples, each according to his ability, determined to send relief to the brethren dwelling in Judea.

Acts 11:29 NKJV

As they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Spirit said, "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." Acts 13:2 NKJV

Then, having fasted and prayed, and laid hands on them, they sent them away. Acts 13:3 NKJV

NOAH'S ARK

Memory Verse: "God keeps us safe." Psalm 4:8 (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: God Keeps Us Safe Because He Loves Us

Parent Engagement: Explore today's craft together. Talk about each animal and its sound as you put it into the ark. Say: "I'm glad that God keeps us safe. Parent Engagement: Play some preschool worship songs. Say: Just like Jehoshaphat praised God, we can praise God, too. Let's use our microphone and sing together or tell Jesus what we love about Him.

Parent Engagement: Read Philippians 2:4-5 then Mark 10:45. Jesus showed us how to serve others. Talk with your kids about something that they could do to serve someone else.
